Dear Parents,

Each year we strive to provide meaningful academic support for our students. The first line of support is our teachers staying after school or coming in early to work with the students from their own Learning Communities. The second is our Standards Club. For those new to our school, Standards Club is a layer of academic support for our students beyond the support normally provided by our teachers.

Each program within our Standards Club has a specific purpose as listed:

**Math** – We offer one day a week of support per grade level. We have designated days and times for 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, and 8<sup>th</sup> grade help across all course levels. Students attend on an as needed basis. Once in this session students are asked to stay until dismissal at 4:25 PM.

**Independent Homework Club** - With the start of Standards Club, we are returning to the routine established in previous years, and requiring that any student staying after school in the library must have work or reading to keep them occupied until 4:00 PM. At that time, the library supervisor will allow students to relax and go on the computer until dismissal at 4:25 PM.

Teachers keeping students after school for extra help may sign these students into the independent homework club after they have completed the extra help session. These students must be escorted to the library by the teacher and signed in by the sending teacher. This is not the case for sports team and clubs. They cannot be dropped off at the library – other arrangements must be made.

**Standards Club** – This is for students in need of support to complete homework or get extra help in their core subjects. Students attend these sessions only if agreed upon in an SST plan, parent request, or teacher request. The supervising teacher must be informed as to the students scheduled to attend each day. All students who are sent to Supervised Homework Club must come with work to do. Once in this session students are asked to stay until dismissal at 4:25 PM.

This year's Standard's Clubs will begin immediately on Monday October 5, 2009. Please refer to this year's schedule listed on the back of this letter.
